# How Senior High Works

- The high school program is structured on a course credit system.
- Credits are accumulated under specific categories.
- Credits are awarded when a passing grade (*50% or higher*) in a course is attained.
  - Courses are typically either 1 or 2 credits.
  - 1 credit courses include 55 hours of instruction.
  - 2 credit courses include 110 hours of instruction.

# What Course Numbers Mean

## Course Grade

*Usually indicates the year in which the course is normally taken.*

- 1 = Level I*
- 2 = Level II*
- 3 = Level III*

## Course Identifier

*Indicates the course for high school certification.*

## Credit Value

- 1 = 1 credit course (55 hours of instruction)*
- 2 = 2 credit course (110 hours of instruction)*

\*(Students must complete courses from any two categories. However, students may use four French credits to fulfill this requirement.)

To graduate high school, you must have a total of **36 credits** from a variety of categories.

# Programming (*General*)

- Typically courses with less material and no final exams.
- University and **some** technical post-secondary programs are not an option.
- Courses include:
  - Math 1202
  - English 1202
  - Literacy 1204
  - Social Studies 2202
  - Science 2200

# Programming (*Academic*)

- The majority of courses are considered *Academic*.
- Core academic courses have final exams.
- Students in the academic program can complete a mixture of academic or advanced courses beginning in Level II.
- Courses include:
  - Math 1201
  - English 1201
  - Social Studies 2201
  - Science 1206

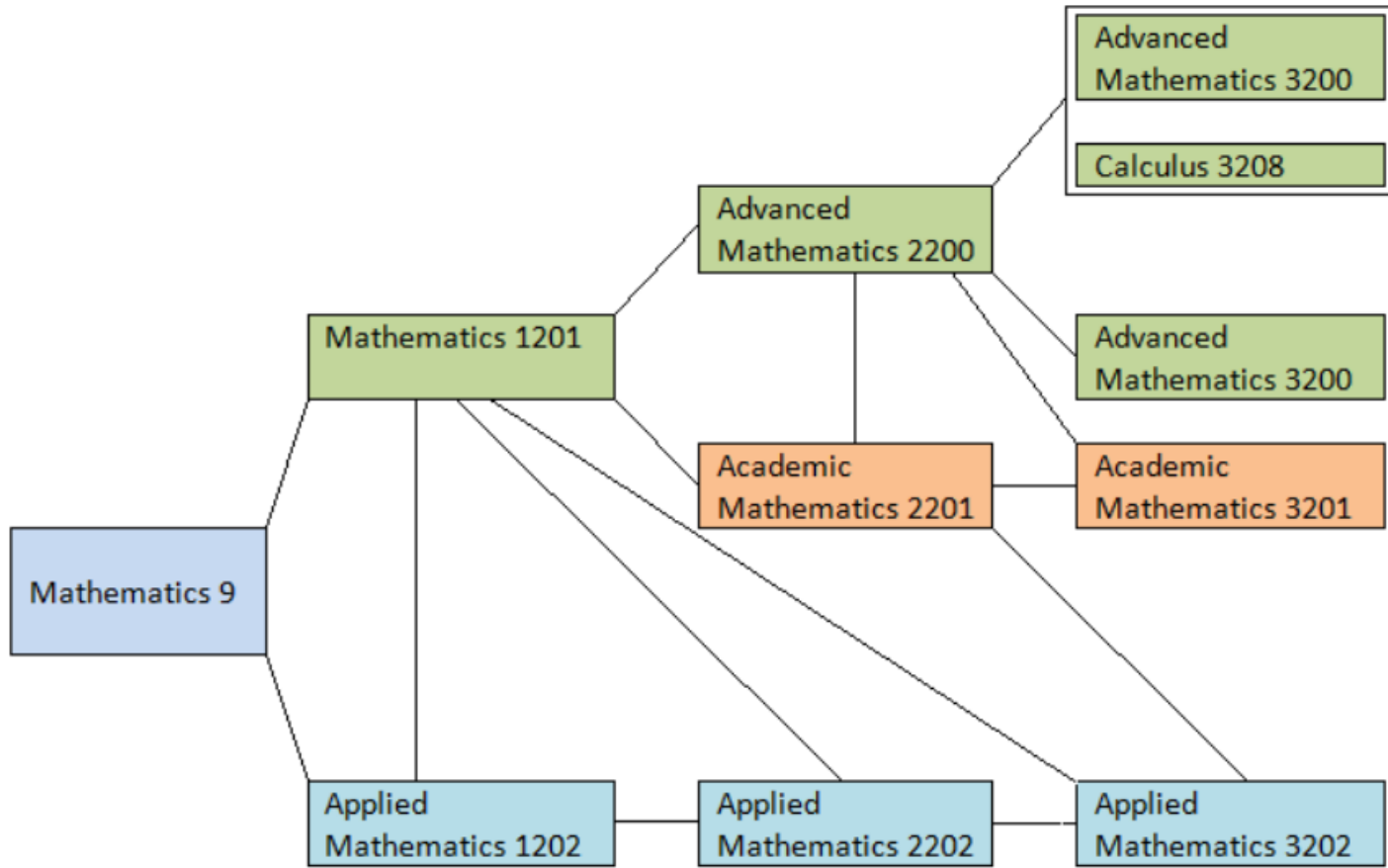


# Programming (*Advanced*)

- Advanced courses are only available in Math.
- Upon entering Level II, students can select Advanced Math courses.
- Students can switch from Advanced to Academic in Level III, but cannot switch from Academic to Advanced.
- Advanced Math courses include:
  - Math 2200
  - Math 3200
  - Math 3208 (*Calculus - optional for Grade 12 students, but must be completed in addition to Math 3200*)

**NOTE: Science 1206 should be done before students attempt any of the pure science courses (biology, chemistry, physics, or earth systems) and the content is essential before attempting Chemistry 2202 or Physics 2204. Completion of Science 1206 is recommended before attempting Biology 2201 or Biology 3201.**

# What Courses Do I Need?

## COLLEGE GENERAL ADMISSION

- Most college programs only require a **high school diploma** (either general or academic).
- Check the program for specific entrance requirements.

## UNIVERSITY GENERAL ADMISSION

- **English 3201**
- **Math 3201 or 3200**
- **Lab Science** (one of): Biology 3201, Chemistry 3202, Physics 3204 or Earth Systems 3209
- **Social Studies** (one of): Social Studies 3201, World Religions 3100/3106 or French 3200
- **Elective:** two credits in any subject area at the 3000 level

## ENGINEERING

- Math 3200
- Chemistry 2202 & 3202
- Physics 2204 & 3204

## NURSING

- Biology 2201 & 3201
- Chemistry 2202 & 3202
