

How Senior High Works

- The high school program is structured on a course credit system.
- Credits are accumulated under specific categories.
- Credits are awarded when a passing grade (50% or higher) in a course is attained.
 - Courses are typically either 1 or 2 credits.
 - 1 credit courses include 55 hours of instruction.
 - 2 credit courses include 110 hours of instruction.

(Students must complete courses from any two categories. However, students may use four French credits to fulfill this requirement.)

To graduate high school, you must have a total of **36** credits from a variety of categories.

Programming (General)

- Typically courses with less material and no final exams.
- University and some technical post-secondary programs are not an option.
- Courses include:
 - Math 1202
 - English 1202
 - Literacy 1204

- Social Studies 2202
- Science 2200

Programming (Academic)

- The majority of courses are considered Academic.
- Core academic courses have final exams.
- Students in the academic program can complete a mixture of academic or advanced courses beginning in Level II.
- Courses include:
 - Math 1201
 - English 1201


- Social Studies 2201

Programming (Advanced)

- Advanced courses are only available in Math.
- Upon entering Level II, students can select Advanced Math courses.
- Students can switch from Advanced to Academic in Level III, but cannot switch from Academic to Advanced.
- Advanced Math courses include:
 Math 2200
 Math 3200
 - Math 3208 (Calculus optional for Grade 12 students, but must be completed in addition to Math 3200)

Mathematics Flow Chart



Completion of Science 1206 is recommended before attempting Biology 2201 or Biology 3201.


