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Course Descriptors and Notes

Applied Music 2206 – This course is designed for the beginning, intermediate and advanced guitar and/or ukulele player. Study is based on the individual student's level. Students do not need to have their own instrument.

Computer Science 1204 – This course provides opportunities to build skills in both block-based and text-based programming languages. Students' purpose for programming is to control physical devices, such as sensors and motors. Students will use their coding and interfacing skills to develop a solution to an authentic problem in an innovation challenge.

Drama 2206 – Explores the various areas of Drama though different dramatic forms. This is not a performance based course but active student participation is required.

Ensemble Performance 1105 (Band) – This course takes place outside of the instructional day. Students who select this course can take 15 credits.

French 2200 – Core French. This is a communication course aimed at developing speaking, reading, writing and representing ideas in French. Instruction and evaluation are thematic and project based.

Human Dynamics 2201 – Students explore each family member's role within the family unit. This course has a "Real Care Baby" that each student will have to care for over a 48 hour period.

Literacy 1204 - Literacy 1204 emphasizes the teaching of cognitive strategies that students use to make meaning of texts as they communicate with others. Teachers create experiences where students use and adapt these strategies as they interact with and create information.

Skilled Trades 1201 – This course explores skilled trades (carpentry, plumbing, electrical, drywall, plastering and painting) through hands on application.

Visual Art 2202 - This is a studio-based course that will enable students to further develop their knowledge and skills in visual arts through practical application within five visual art disciplines.

Writing 2203 – Designed to accommodate a wide range of student interests and abilities and offers students an opportunity to explore writing as a means of personal expression as well as a method of communication.
